After a chance conversation at the end of a school assembly on being safe around building sites, we now has a school entrance to be proud of!



Anneka Jones, Social Value Coordinator from Countryside Partnerships hosted an assembly in the school before the summer holidays about site safety and job prospects in construction, before setting a challenge for students to design a poster to display on their nearby site. As Countryside staff were leaving the school, a further opportunity to support the local community was chanced upon.

The new wild area will not only provide a place for nature, but it will make the entrance to the school something to be proud of. A massive thanks to everyone involved




### **Science Outside**

Year 5 in science have completed two outdoor lessons on our current topic 'Living things and their Habitats'.

One lesson was an invertebrate hunt looking for the different types of invertebrates found in the local area- they found; insects, annelids, crustaceans, myriapods, arachnids and molluscs.



The second lesson was searching for habitats – Yr. 5 looked at the conditions of them e.g. temperature, food source, water source, sun light etc.



They completed some sketches of them too for a more focused study back in class.

#### **Electronic Device Santa Gifts**

It is that time of year where Santa maybe particularly generous bringing new electronic devices for children. It is vital that these are set up so that children can access age appropriate material. If you do this at the outset (obviously after Santa has delivered any gifts) then it will ensure that your children's devices will be protected and give you more control. Make a family agreement

Making a family agreement is a great way to think about how your family uses the internet, and to help make sure that everybody understands the importance of staying safe and positive online.

A family agreement is a chance for you to make agreements about your use of the internet. It can include how often you use technology, if it is allowed to be used in communal spaces like at the kitchen table, and if permission needs to be gained before downloading any new apps.

### Talk to your child about using tech safely

One of the most important things you can do before handing over a piece of technology is to talk to your child.

Having a conversation shows your child that you are engaged in their online lives, and shows that you are available and interested in helping them should they face difficulties whilst using technology or spending time online. Some conversation starters that could help you to have these discussions include:

### What will you use this device for?

Can you show me what your favourite thing to do online is?

Can you show me how to play on your favourite game?

What tips can you give me about spending time online?

What is OK and not OK to share online?

What would you do if something worries you whilst you're online?

Do you know how you block or report on the games you're playing? Can you show me how to do it?

### Applications open for Reception and Junior School Places

Please note that the deadline for Reception and Junior school places comes around very soon after Christmas (15 January 2022). This applies to children born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019 for Reception, and any child currently in Year 2 at an infant school who want to move to a junior school.

To help parents and carers to make successful applications, there is a video with lots of practical tips and advice, plus a written guide with useful information on how the process works. If they'd like to learn more, or ask questions of the school admissions team, two online webinars are being held in early December, which are open to everyone and free to join. All applications received by the deadline of 15 January will receive a school offer on 17 April next year, which is National Offer Day. Any applications submitted after the 15 January deadline will only be considered after this, meaning the child is much less likely to be offered a place at a preferred school.

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
