Attendance

The school attendance for year is currently 95.96%. Thank you to all carers/parents for supporting your child's education by getting them into school. We do understand that life can get in the way sometimes, and getting a child up, ready and in on time, whilst there are other distractions e.g. younger children, can be tricky, we do appreciate your efforts.

We are aware that picking up time can be a challenge, this term, if you have children at other schools, we have passed on your frustrations. be rest assured that we will make sure. Be rest assured that your children remain with us until you can get to us.



As we are not a primary school, we always feel that your children aren't with us very long, which is a shame, but life moves on, and so here's the details for our Year 6 carers/ parents.

The deadline for 2024 Secondary School places is **31 October 2023**.

All applications received by the deadline of 31 October will receive a school offer on 1 March next year, which is National Offer Day. Any applications submitted after the deadline will only be considered after this, meaning the child is much less likely to be offered a place at a preferred school.

Applications should be made online at: https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/applying-secondary-school-place where you can also find lots of useful information on school transport, priority school areas and admissions criteria.

We can offer no guidance on your choice of school, but to urge you go all Open Days to gain as much information you can about this next step in your child's education. We will send out information from secondary schools if they have contacted us first.

Free Online Monitoring at Home

Keeping your child safe is on of our fundamental values as a school, no more so in this digital age we live in.

As part of the school's Digital Safeguarding subscription, we have access to the Smoothwall Online Safety Hub.

Smoothwall's Online Safety Hub is designed to give school staff the knowledge and confidence to speak to children about safe digital behaviours.

It's a central place where students and staff can find out about key online safety topics or request articles from safeguarding experts, of their own choosing.

As part of this we can also extend this to you by giving you access to up to date digital safety information, app reviews from digital safety experts, and in depth information on popular social media and gaming platforms.

- measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated
- measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain.
 Measles can kill
- your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the MMR vaccination
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection

- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected
