We also want to acknowledge that this transition coincides with leadership


change. We are confident that the MAT has the capacity and expertise to support the school through this period of change. Leadership support will be in place to ensure continuity and stability for our children and families.

Our School




Absence Patterns - 48 pupils have been absent before or after a school holiday.


DfE Penalty Notice Threshold - (10+ unauthorised absences in 10 rolling school weeks)

Academisation Consultation Update

This is to acknowledge the closure of the consultation regarding the proposal for Exhall Junior School to convert to an academy within the Griffin Schools Trust.

Governors would like to thank the school community for their participation in the formal consultation held from 11th April to 2nd May, extended until 8th May to allow for face-to-face meetings with colleagues from the Griffin Schools Trust.

Governors are committed to working with parents, carers and the wider community and knew it was important for everyone to be able to ask questions, explore the proposal in more detail, and be involved in the consultation.

Following the consultation, governors are pleased to acknowledge that parents / carers support the proposal and therefore

governors will proceed with the conversion of Exhall Junior School to academy status and join the Griffin Schools Trust.

Deciding to become an academy is a significant step in the life of the school and one that has not be taken lightly. At all stages in the process governors' key concern has been what is in the best interests, both now and in the long term, of the pupils, families, staff and community of Exhall Junior School.

Joining the Griffin Schools Trust, an organisation that shares our values and ethos, means that our school will be in a supportive partnership which will benefit not only the teachers and support staff who work with your children on a day-to-day basis but also the organisation and administration of the school, making it ever more efficient and resilient.

Over the next few weeks, the processes and documentation necessary to finalise the conversion will be completed. We anticipate that this will all be in place for 1st September, and we will begin the new academic year as an academy within the Griffin Schools Trust.

In the meantime, we understand that this process may raise further questions or concerns, and we are committed to keeping you informed, so please do not hesitate to get in touch if you have any further questions.


Singing Event



Year 3 and 4 had a wonderful end to the day event as they performed some of the songs they have been learning with our singing teacher, Jeremy, to the rest of the school.


They worked hard to rehearse the songs, often splitting into two or even four-part harmonies. They then performed, listening to Jeremy's direction carefully and performing superb actions too!

Bun Day

This annual event is held in the Almshouses to mark the life of the town's most famous Rector and this year was well attended by pupils as well as guests, residents Governors and townsfolk. Exhall Junior School were represented by our Heads and Deputies, Mrs Randle, Mrs Robinson and Mr Mann.

After the service the children receive a sticky fruit bun and so, not surprisingly, the event has become affectionately known as "Bun Day", but it wasn't always like this. In the past, all the residents of the Almshouses and the school children were provided with a dinner by the charity to commemorate Founder's Day.



The children's meal was stopped during Victorian times when the numbers considerably increased, and a bun was given to each child instead.

The old residents enjoyed their Founder's Day dinner until the second world war, when severe rationing caused it to be discontinued. The tradition was revived in 2000 and once again the residents can

celebrate the vision of Nicholas Chamberlaine.



Due to a kind donation from the Nicholas Chamberlaine Trust, children in Exhall Juniors also received a book, as well as a buttered bun on the last day of half term.
